AIM STATEMENT

To increase the attendance of patients with inflammatory diseases at the Rheumatology Traveling Consultation clinic at Wrinch Memorial Hospital to 90% by September 2024.

BACKGROUND/PROBLEM

My practice mainly consists of Indigenous persons who live with immune – mediated inflammatory disease. Due to the poor attendance at clinic appointments, I cannot provide continuity of care. This leads to a higher burden of pain and reduction of function in this patient population.


CHANGE IDEAS

- Reviewing the reminder call process with the team will create a more effective process
- Integrating Motivational Interviewing will support patient self management
- Develop an orientation for new patients
- Conduct follow up calls with patients who have missed an appointment

MEASURES

- Outcome: 90% of booked appointments attended
- **Process:** Standardized booking & follow up for every appointment
- Balancing: Increased workload for MOA


DRIVER DIAGRAM




► NEXT STEPS
